Parish Council Meeting

14th November 2023

The formal Minutes of this meeting will be published on the website but here are a few highlights:-

Speeding – this had been a cause for concern for several months. The temporary 20mph speed limits in neighbouring villages will, we believe, be extended to Tostock in a month or two. The Parish Council will work with the County Councillor to look at 40mph speed limits coming into the village – from the Leys, along Norton Road and also Church Road.

Village Sign Redesign. A new design for the Village sign had been produced by a resident of Tostock. Councillors have suggested that this proposal should be considered at the Annual Parish Meeting on 9th April 2024. They also suggested that if any other designs were put forward they should also be considered.

Dates for meetings in 2024 are 9th January, 12th March, 9th April (Annual Parish Meeting), 14th May (Annual Parish Council Meeting), 9th July, 10th September and 12th November. Other meetings may be called if there are urgent matters to be discussed.

Throughout my entire lifespan, I can count on both hands the number of famous celebrities that I have met, shaking hands, or being in conversation with. Just before he became King I met and shook hands with Prince Charles at the annual Sandringham Flower Show. As I am a member of the Scout Association Movement to this present day. On three separate occasions I met the movements chief scout of the U.K. First at Gilwell Park Scouts headquarters – 1967 with Sir Charles McClean, 1980's Major-General Michael Walsh at Ipswich and more recently in Bradfield Park, Bury St Edmunds district scout ground the present Chief Scout Bear Grylls. In the mid eighties at my works hatchery some local VIP's, amongst them was our local MP Sir Eldon Griffiths. On arrival of entering the property he immediately came across to me and shook my hand before meeting the hierarchy. Whether he recognised me from the Scouts or other functions from around town, I shall never know. Not forgetting our own Tostock celebrities, because of the Owl Project, I was fortunate enough to meet the Late Air Marshall Sir John Kembell and Lady Val – my best wishes go to her. Also their son-in-law who went onto become the Lord Mayor of London and recently received a Knighthood – Sir Charles Bowman and Lady Samantha in which I feel honoured.







John and Lucy's family home - Aigas House

The greatest entertainment star which was my lifelong idol – the American Country Singer, the legendary Slim Whitman at Cambridge Corn Exchange in 1990, At that time aged 80 and still singing, it was his final U.K. tour where I met him and shook his hand after the show – one of the greatest moments of my life, unfortunately I had no camera. Last but not least I want to introduce to you and make this a feature for this edition. He is a most influential, and friendliest, warm -hearted person who I have ever met with a great sense of humour. He is Sir John Lister-Kaye, who is he you may ask? So let me explain, I first met him at the Aigas Field Centre, Beauly, Inverness-shire. It was in 2017 Penny and myself decided to have a holiday there, and John was our host so that's why for this edition I want to share with you the whole Aigas experience but please don't think I am bragging or boasting and regard it a privilege and pleasure. Sir John Lister-Kaye is one of Britain's best-known naturalists and conservationists. He is the author of nine books on wildlife and the environment, including "At the Water's Edge, and has lectured all over the world. He has served prominently in the RSPB, the Nature Conservancy Council, Scottish Natural Heritage and the Scottish Wildlife Trust. In 2003 He was awarded an OBE for services to nature conservation. He lives with his wife Lady Lucy and family among the mountains of the Scottish Highlands, where he runs the world-famous Aigas Field Centre. I personally have high regards for Sir John and rate him on the same par as Sir David Attenborough. The pioneering Aigas Field Centre first opened in 1977, now 45 years in running. Its Scotland's first and foremost centre for nature study and wildlife holidays, from where qualified and dedicated rangers will lead you to

The wild highlands and islands to seek out and understand the unique and celebrated natural environment of this special part of the world. You can join one of their week long holiday programmes, which cover a range of different interests, or

allow them to create a tailor-made experience on a time frame that suits you however, they are so much more than a staging post for your daily adventures. To stay at Aigas is in itself a unique pleasure they call it the Aigas experience. You arrive at a private family estate. Here is the map of the estate.



All the photographs that you see in this article I have taken are all within the estate. Tucked into a natural

bowl on the sunny side of Strathglass – a beautiful wooded and secluded glen



through which the River Glass flows from high mountainous peaks of Glen Affric to the estuarine mud flats of the Beauly Firth. Around the Victorian house of Aigas are attractive gardens and a fine arboretum. Nestled amongst the towering sequoias, cedars and other exotic trees is your lodge, a comfortable woodland hideaway with wildlife all around. Where you are treated as a guest of the family, Sir John greets you every morning and evening, nothing is too much trouble to make your stay special. You will dine in the great hall

every night with home-made and hearty fair. The fires are crackling and the candles are lit as you discuss your days adventures and look forward to tomorrow, the hall is used again in the mornings for your breakfast.

Macintosh Lodge where we stayed and the great hall. The staff are friendly, well trained and like Sir John they have a great sense of humour too, as well as guiding you during the day they will be there in the evening to pour you a glass of wine or to help you identify that particular beetle or fungus you've found.



On the estate itself they have pine martens, badgers, beavers, and otters in the loch, red and roe deer, foxes running wild and the Scottish Wild Cat captive breeding programme. Their private network of nature trails and wildlife hides are yours to use as you like. Many of the guests like to go for a wander around the loch before breakfast, for some quiet contemplation in the hope of a fishing Osprey or crossing paths with roe deer, fox or pine marten.

There are four wildlife viewing hides providing different wildlife opportunities, the first one built by Johnny Kingdom (tv wildlife presenter) in 2007 to watch for beavers and otters, and fishing osprey on the Aigas loch.
